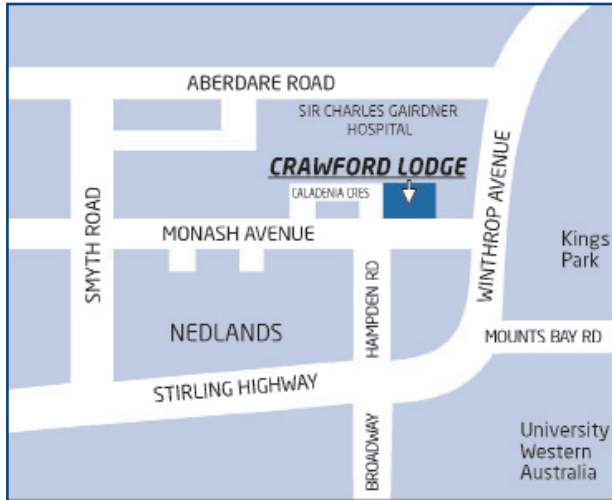

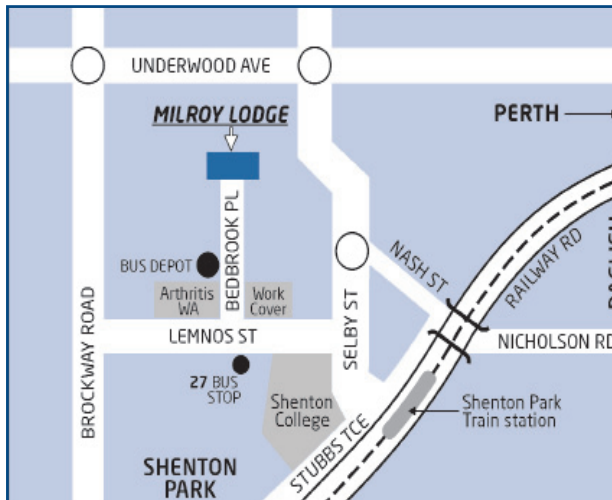

Dedicated accommodation service for country people

For many years Cancer Council Western Australia has been assisting country people in their fight against cancer by providing a range of services, including subsidised accommodation in Perth for those who need to travel to the city for treatment.

Crawford Lodge in Nedlands and Milroy Lodge in Shenton Park offer comfortable motel style accommodation in a warm, caring and supportive environment.

We do not provide nursing care, so our guests must be self-caring. Milroy Lodge is primarily for patients who are staying alone, however a carer can be accommodated for short periods if required. Carers are welcome to stay in both facilities whilst the patient is in hospital.

Food

Continental breakfast supplies are included in the daily tariff. The supply and cost of all other food is the responsibility of the guest. Frozen microwavable meals and other food stuffs are also available to purchase at very reasonable prices.

Cleaning and linen service

Each room is serviced weekly, and when the room is vacated. All linen and towels are provided.

Costs

Cancer patients who live 100kms or more from Perth may not have to incur any costs to stay at Cancer Council WA accommodation. They may be eligible for funding through the Patient Assisted Travel Scheme (PATS). If cover is approved, Cancer Council WA will invoice PATS direct for the cost of their accommodation.

Application for assistance must be made before commencing the journey to Perth. Details of how to apply for PATS cover can be obtained from the patient's GP or local hospital. It must be noted that if confirmation of PATS cover is not received by the check-in date the accommodation costs remain the responsibility of the guest.

Department of Veteran's Affairs Gold Repatriation Health Card and White Repatriation for Specific Conditions Health Card holders may also be covered for the cost of the accommodation. Such costs are the responsibility of the guest and then claimed back from DVA direct.

Telephone charges are the responsibility of the guest throughout their stay.

Checking in

Reception is open weekdays from 8:00am to 6:00pm and Saturdays and Sundays from 8:00am to 12:00 noon. Rooms will be available from 1:00pm. Guests are asked to check-in during reception hours, unless transport arrival times prevent this. Check-out time is 11:00am.



All rooms have:

- Ensuite bathroom
- Refrigerator
- Tea and coffee making facilities
- Telephone and television
- Reverse cycle airconditioning

Other facilities include:

- Free laundry
- Family rooms
- Lending library with internet access
- Gymnasium
- Barbecues
- Communal kitchen/dining and recreation areas
- Wig service
- Free transport to treatment centres
- Weekly shopping trip

We also have a weekly social calendar including morning and afternoon teas and a range of recreational activities
